The United '74 Inc. Scholarship award recipients must be available to attend and participate in the Annual United '74 Scholarship Award Program, scheduled for April 18, 2020 at Poynor Adult Education Center, 301 S. Dargan Street Florence, SC., 29506.

Award: Award recipients must present their official class schedule for the Fall session immediately following their high school graduation for the school they will attend (schedule will be verified with the school). The award totaling \$1,000 dollars includes: a certificate of achievement, cash, laptop computer and printer. The award will be presented once student's schedule is verified.

Applications must be completed and mailed to United '74 Inc. by the suspense date, February 15, 2020. Applicants must submit a head and shoulder photo, maximum 1 page bio: addressing background, educational objective, career goals and why you should be awarded the 2020 United '74 Inc., Scholarship Award.

Bios can be **typed or legibly hand written.** Illegible, sloppy, dirty or incomplete applications <u>will not</u> be accepted.

Required Documents:

- 1. **Completed application form (see Guidance Counselor or obtain from united74.org website)
- 2. **Proof FAFSA Form has been completed and submitted.
- 3. **Copy of Letter of Acceptance must be presented before award can be made.
- 4. **Biography—Include background information, family dynamics, educational objective, career goals, and why you're deserving of this scholarship.
- 5. **Provide head and shoulder photo.
- 6. **Copy of high school transcript.
- 7. **Copy of complete high school attendance record.
- 8. **Three (3) letters of support from your school teachers, school administrator, Pastor or employer.
- 9. Application and required documents must be post marked no later than the midnight of the due date.

All scholarship recipients must be enrolled in a degree, certification or job placement program and have Letters of Acceptance from an accredited, 2yr/4yr college, technical or vocational school as part of the application package and by the time of interview session with United '74 Inc Scholarship Committee. Student classes must be scheduled to start at the beginning of fall school year immediately following student's graduation from high school. Additionally, the selected candidate must remain fully eligible until they are fully and completely enrolled and have their class schedule from the school of their choice. Failure to do so will void the agreement with United '74 Inc. and the alternate candidate will be awarded, if he or she is enrolled in an accredited college, technical or vocational school.

(Confirmation of school enrollment and scheduled courses will be verified prior to awarding scholarship).

All Documents must be computer generated, typed or legibly written. Illegible, sloppy, dirty or incomplete applications will not be considered. All documents completed on a computer must be type in Times New Roman and font size 12. Biography must not exceed 1½ page in length. Type-writer written and hand written biography must not exceed two (2) pages.
